Recycling totals:

Peculiar: Dec.—3.38 tons

Drexel: Dec —3.19 tons

Garden City: Dec— 3.64 tons

Total tonnage recycled at mobile units in 2011: 179.41

(tonnage for Sept event in Drexel was not sent and not obtainable. Using 2 tons —least tonnage collected in 2011 was 2.15— would make the total 181.41)

Breakdown by location for 2011:

Freeman: 32.08

Belton: 39.69

Peculiar: 40.06

Drexel: 32.7

Garden City: 36.88

Comparison with average tonnage collected in previous years:

2009: 8.2 tons

2010: 12.67

2011: 15.12

These figures indicate continued participation/tonnage collected at the mobile events. It is important also to consider that additional recycling opportunities have been made available by Town & Country with small recycling bins at a number of other locations on a permanent basis. Many of the schools in Cass County have been supplied with these bins, and in addition to school use, many residents take their recyclable materials to these bins rather than wait for the scheduled events with the result that more trash is diverted from the waste stream than our numbers indicate because of the education and efforts of all involved with the scheduled mobile recycling program!
